THE DAMPIER PENINSULA

The striking contrast of red pindan cliffs, white sand beaches and clear turquoise waters creates the perfect backdrop for a unique cultural and coastal adventure on the Dampier Peninsula.

The Peninsula stretches for 200km north from Broome, all the way to Cape Leveque at its tip, and along its length are dotted a multitude of out-of-the-way destinations, each more breathtaking than the last.

Kooljaman at Cape Leveque and Cygnet Bay Pearl Farm both offer a range of accommodation to suit all budgets, from camping to luxury eco-tents and bungalows, and a range of once-in-a-lifetime experiences in Aboriginal culture, pearling, cruising and more. Go fishing, mud crabbing or learn ancient hunting techniques. Taste bush foods, swim in the sparkling waters, go snorkelling, or simply relax and enjoy the pristine beaches and bays.



EATING AND DRINKING

Broome has a food and drink scene as diverse as its multicultural past - Chinese, Japanese, Indian, Malay, Thai, Indonesian, Vietnamese, Mexican, Italian and of course Aussie pub grub. Whether it's fine dining or a food van you're after, Broome has it all.

Experience award-winning craft beers at Matso's Broome Brewery, unique gins created from rare bush botanicals at Moontide Distillery or the Kimberley Coffee Company's specialist roasts. The full gamut of fine dining options are on offer across establishments such as The Aarli, Bali Hai Café, Cable Beach Club Resort's in-house restaurants and bars, the Mangrove Resort, Zookeeper's Store and 1861 at Oaks Broome.





HORIZONTAL FALLS

Described by Sir David Attenborough as "one of the greatest natural wonders of the world", the Horizontal Falls is a natural phenomenon as intriguing as it is stunning.

In the turquoise water of Talbot Bay, the fast-moving tidal current squeezes through two narrow gorges in the McLarty Range, pushing the water into rapid-like formations which rush through the gaps at an astonishing rate, producing waterfalls turned on their side.

Located in the Buccaneer Archipelago this unique waterfall is not accessible by vehicle. You can view the Horizontal Falls from the air with a scenic flight from Broome or Derby, get up close with an extended cruise or visit by float plane and land at the Horizontal Falls.



PEARLING

Broome's story is forever entwined with the pearling industry, and it's said that the town was founded on buttons.


For many years the town's rhythms were marked by the departure and return of the pearling luggers on the ebb and flow of the 10m tides. Their cargo was the prized Pinctada Maxima mother of pearl, used to make buttons and fine cutlery.

Today, Broome is still known for its pearling industry, which produces some of the finest pearls in the world.

You can discover the chequered history of this romantic industry from its perilous early days to modern methods of cultured pearling at Pearl Luggers, on a guided tour, by following the selfguided Jetty to Jetty Walk and Pearling Timeline, and visiting the Broome Museum.

Ningaloo Marine Park is one of the few places in the world where you can have a unique marine interaction. Swim with the big three – manta rays, whalesharks, or humpback whales out of either Coral Bay or Exmouth (March to July for Whalesharks, July to October for Humpbacks, all year round for Mantas). The best time to visit this part of the Coral Coast is between March and October for the seasonal wildlife experiences, however, there are unforgettable adventures available all year.

Explore all sorts of sea life, from turtles and tropical fish with a snorkel on the Ningaloo Reef when you visit Exmouth or Coral Bay. This amazing fringing reef is accessible by simply stepping off the beach and into the sea. If you prefer to stay above the water, you can see the coral gardens on board a glass bottom boat in Coral Bay.

Take your pick from diving, snorkelling or kayaking tours to explore this World Heritage-listed natural marvel. Fish with an expert tour operator who knows where the fish are!

Besides the many beautiful beaches, dive sites, snorkel trails, fishing spots, wildlife and marine interactions, adventure also awaits you on land with the striking canyons of Cape Range National Park. Home to limestone ranges and spectacular gorges, hike to the top of the range for awesome panoramic views, and look out for rare black-footed rock wallaby on the way.

Looking for bragging rights? Try a range of unique accommodation options such as glamping it up in style in eco luxury tents, exploring wildlife and generally soaking up the sun onboard an overnight cruise out of Coral Bay, or staying at an authentic outback station.

Back on land, there are plenty of food and beverage options to reward your adventures. Check out the local micro-breweries in Exmouth, pouring artisan craft beer brewed on-site.
